

- results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
  - Should any question or matter arise not provided for in these Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be final, subject only to appeal to the Kennel Club.
  - Should any judge be unable to fulfil their appointment, the Committee reserves to themselves the right to appoint another in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be refunded.
  - The Committee will be empowered to exclude or remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition either from illness, disease, vice, natural or other causes and if such exclusion takes place either before or after judging the entry fee will be forfeited.
  - The Committee will not be responsible for claims for injury or compensation occasioned by or arising from the holding of the Show or reason of act or default of any person.
  - The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other person, that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to any dog or person from any cause whatsoever nor of any act or omission, their officers, agents and others. It is on this understanding only that their entries are received.
  - Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car and caravan parks and approaches.
  - The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue) during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
  - A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
  - Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

#### DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

The Sports Complex (where our Championship Shows are held) to the venue of Baginton Village Hall (CV8 3AB) is only 3.6 Miles.

- FROM THE WEST** At Tollbar End, leave the A45 and take 3rd exit onto Siskin Drive.  
**FROM THE EAST** At Tollbar End, leave the A46 at exit for A45 and take 2nd exit onto Siskin Drive.

- At next roundabout, take 2nd exit onto Rowley Road.
- At next roundabout, continue straight onto Frances Road (308 yards).

### BEST IN SHOW, BEST PUPPY IN SHOW and BEST VETERAN IN SHOW

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word 'dog' includes both sexes)

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. Saturday 18th August 2015.

<b>PUPPY</b>	For dogs of 6 months and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>JUNIOR</b>	For dogs of 6 months of age and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>POST GRADUATE</b>	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate, or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
<b>LIMIT</b>	For all dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the KENNEL Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all of Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
<b>OPEN</b>	For all dogs of the breeds for which a class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
<b>VETERAN</b>	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>ADVISORY NOTICE</b>	
<b>NOT FOR COMPETITION</b>	Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds dogs not included in the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed. Dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at a Single Breed and Sub-Group Shows.

Full details of all dogs entered NFC must be included on the entry form.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.30 am
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 11.30 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after judging has been completed.
5. Entry Fees. Members First Entry @ £5 (per dog) ; Non-Members First Entry @ £6 (per dog) . Each subsequent entry @ £1. Not for competition (over 4 months) Free. Catalogues £1, (pre-paid with entries ONLY)
6. There is no prize money on offer at this show. Rosettes for Class Winners, BOB, BIS, Reserve BIS, BPIS, Reserve BPIS and Best Veteran.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of Bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show.
  - a) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
  - b) Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
  - c) Proviso  
For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
11. Best in Show.
  - a) The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from dogs beaten only by the dog declared Best in Show.
  - b) Withdrawal from other competition  
Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from AV Classes when judged before Breed Classes.
  - c) Proviso  
For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes have elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. No modification will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete Number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.  
When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams  
If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.  
The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.  
Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.  
When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.  
Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.  
Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.  
Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire

**REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION  
OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A.42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the Show and from any awards gained thereat.
  - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A.42.
2.
  - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
  - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of a dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alter the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
  - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by any official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

**Dog Fouling F8 (a)**

Any owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car parks and approaches. The Society will arrange for the dispersal of suitable receptacles to assist compliance with Regulation F8 (a).

**Attraction of Exhibits F(1) 17f**

The attracting of exhibits by any method from outside the ring is prohibited. It is the duty of the Judge, Steward or Show Manager noticing such attraction to ask that it cease.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
